Pedestrian Crossing Upgrade on Bernard Street, Cheltenham

Background

The Council is taking steps to enhance safety and convenience for residents, shoppers, and school children in Bernard Street, Cheltenham.

To address these concerns, we have planned the installation of a new pedestrian crossing and additional traffic improvements outside 41 Bernard Street (near the intersection of Rosewarne Avenue and Bernard Street).

This is aimed at creating a safer environment for all pedestrians crossing Bernard Street.

Council Actions

We are excited to share the concept design plan, which outlines the proposed improvements in detail.

These include the construction of a built-out kerb, pedestrian crossing line markings, and the installation of a center median island, all of which will be carried out in the near future.

We are committed to working together to create a safer and more accessible Bernard Street for all residents, shop-goers, and school children. We invite you to provide feedback on the design should you have queries or concerns.

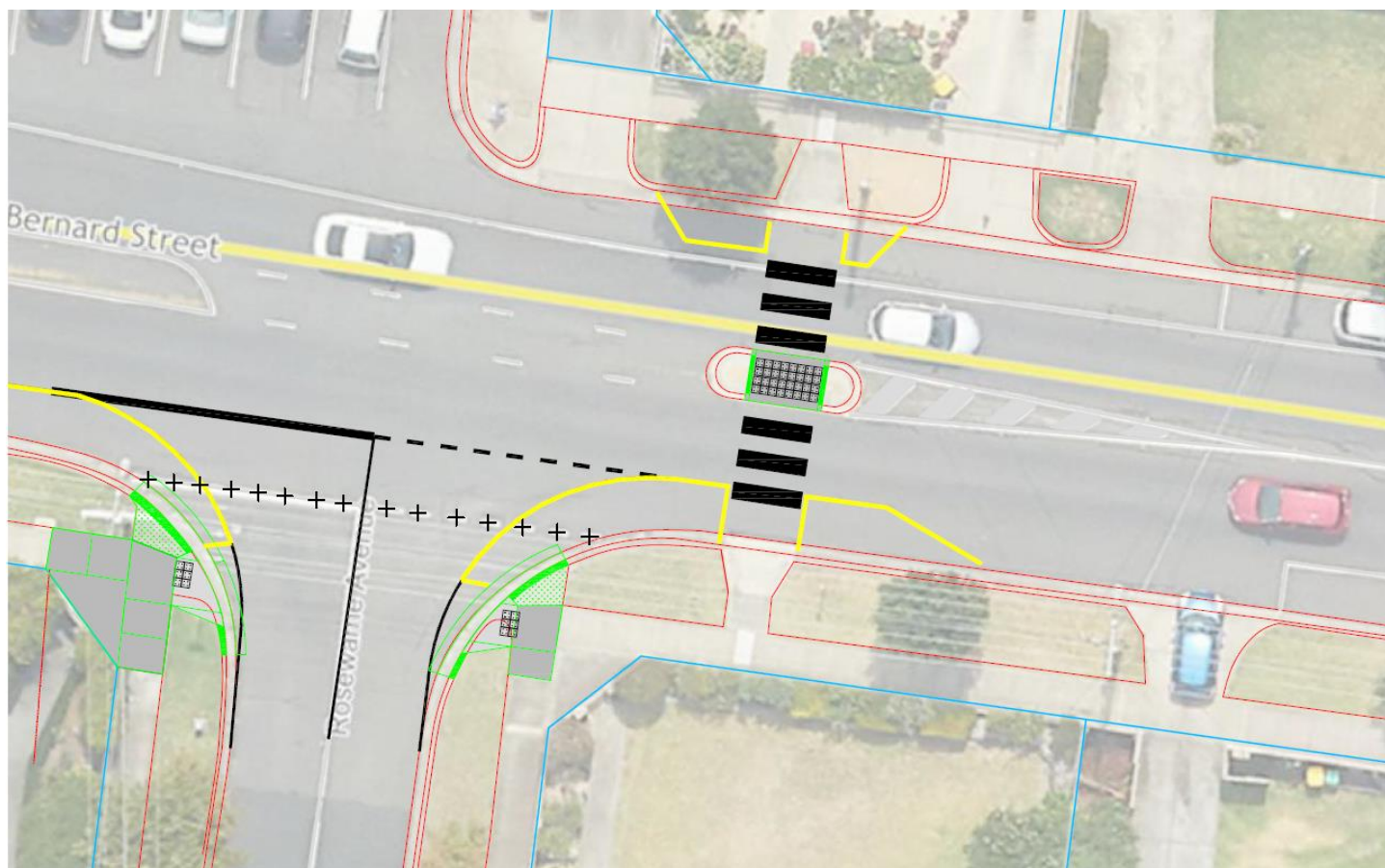


Figure 1: Depiction of proposed pedestrian crossing upgrade and additional traffic treatments to be installed outside 41 Bernard Street, Cheltenham.
