Shared user path improvements along Edithvale Road, Chelsea Heights.

Every year we invest significantly in Kingston's roads, footpath, and drainage network to support the current and future needs of our community as well as creating a cycling and pedestrian-friendly Kingston.

As part of this investment, we are planning works to improve the shared user path network along Edithvale Road, to improve the experience of travelling around the local wetlands.

These works, which will be delivered in two stages, have been identified as high priority projects by our community. They will improve safety and access for all our community while also enhancing the visitor experience in the area. Please refer to the attached plans for more details.

Details and indicative timings of the works are as follows:

• Stage 1: Shared path connection improvements at the Edithvale Seaford Education Centre Car Park

The works include:

- a new shared path connection between existing path networks to provide a more seamless user experience.
- o new pram crossings,
- o signage and solar lighting to enhance user safety and minimise impact on the local environment.

The works are expected to get underway in late 2024/early 2025 and will take around 4 weeks to complete.

• Stage 2: A new boardwalk along the south side of Edithvale Road is proposed (between the car park at Edithvale–Seaford Wetland Education Centre and the bird viewing pavilion car park).

The works include:

- the construction of a new elevated boardwalk (approximately 300m in length) with handrails and solar lighting,
- new concrete shared path connections at either end that will improve accessibility and safety for all users.

The stage 2 works are currently in the design and approvals phase. Construction timelines will be announced closer to finalisation of design works.


