To the resident,

White Street / Myrtle Street / McDonald Street, Mordialloc, Footpath Reconstruction

Every year we invest significantly in Kingston's roads, paths, and drainage network to support the current and future needs of our community.

We plan to reconstruct sections of footpath and pram ramps along Myrtle Street, White Street and McDonald Street to improve the safety and usability for pedestrians and residents.

The improvements will include the following:

- Reconstruction of the footpath along the west side of Myrtle Street
- Reconstruction of the footpath between the south-east corner of Myrtle Street and McDonald Street
- Construction of a shared user path along White Street

Significant trees will be retained, and tree protection measures will be in place during the works. We've attached a plan with further details.

Construction Details

Works are expected to be undertaken in late 2024 and will take around three weeks to complete. More specific information regarding the timing of the works will be available when a contractor is appointed by Council.

The construction works will restrict access to some pedestrian areas and as well as the driveways at 1-5 Myrtle Street for short periods of time. We will aim to minimise disruption and will provide adequate signage for alternative pathways.

Closer to the time of construction additional information will be provided, with details on who to contact during construction.

We look forward to delivering these improvements for the community.
