
The Year 4 Action Plan combines Council's social action plans into one, bringing actions for different population groups together with our community's priorities to help Kingston be a connected, resilient and sustainable community.

The Year 4 Action Plan is also not an exhaustive list of every health and wellbeing action that Council delivers. Health and wellbeing actions are embedded in the day-to-day operations of many Council departments and their partners. As such, the actions in the Year 4 Action Plan are either new, high profile/impact or have a signature budget.

Actions are listed in the goal and objective related to their primary purpose, however it is important to note that they may also contribute positive health outcomes or have co-benefits in other goals and objectives.

Intersectional approach

The preparation of the MPHWP 2021-2025 included research and analysis of health data through an intersectional lens. While the action plan overall takes a 'whole of community' and life course approach, to address health inequities identified through the intersectional analysis, certain population groups are prioritised for certain actions.



Intersectionality refers to the way that different characteristics of a person can potentially expose them to multiple layers of discrimination and marginalisation¹. This could include discrimination arising due to age, gender identity, ethnicity, disability, mental health and socioeconomic status, which when overlapped, may lead to poorer access to health services and health outcomes.

The intersectional lens enables inequities experienced by different population groups to be factored into the planning and delivery of actions, helping to reduce barriers and improve access and participation.

Throughout the action plan the font of identified population groups is

presented in the following colours: Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people, children, LGBTIQA+, low income, men, multicultural people, older people, people with disabilities, young people and women. When a population group is not listed, a whole of community approach is assumed.

Monitoring and reporting

In Year 4, progress reporting and monitoring of actions in this Action Plan will occur through CAMMS. An annual review will be conducted, and a Year 4 Achievements Report produced to highlight key successes and outcomes.
