Seaford Wetlands shared user path upgrade

We are writing to you to provide you an update on the Seaford Wetlands Rejuvenation Project.

The Victorian Government is funding \$5 million of upgrades at the Seaford Wetlands (which includes \$1.0M towards the shared path) with a focus on:

- Improving safety, access, and connection for visitors
- Strengthening the wetlands' ecological health
- Embedding cultural values into the wetlands' design and management.

The State Government and Frankston City Council have led most of the wetlands projects, partnering with Kingston to deliver the shared user path component at Patterson Lakes. This will create a full pedestrian and cycling circuit around the wetlands.

We will be tendering for these works shortly, with the project expected to be delivered in mid-2025.

Project details

A new 2.5m wide concrete shared use path will be created between Old Wells Road and the Melbourne Water Pump Station near 118 Palm Beach Drive (rear), along the northern side of Kananook Creek.

The path will connect to the existing footpath in Palm Beach Drive in front of the Melbourne Water Pump Station, creating the link to the newly constructed pedestrian bridge west of the Melbourne Water Pump Station.

Construction details

Works are expected to be undertaken in autumn 2025 and will take up to 12 weeks to complete.
